Rent Choice Youth Subsidy

Rent Choice is a private rental subsidy that helps you pay the rent for up to 3 years.

It supports access to safe and affordable housing for eligible clients who can show that they can sustain a tenancy in the private rental market.


To be eligibile:

- aged 16 to 24 years old,
- don't have your own place to live (you might be sleeping on a couch at a friend's place, in a shelter or boarding house or at risk of homelessness),
- are an Australian Citizen or Australian permanent resident, and
- are motivated to work or complete study or training to help obtain a job,
- are willing to engage with a support provider, who will help you engage in training, education and employment
- are on a low income or studying

Samaritans

Specialist Homelessness Service (SHS)

SHS provides a range of shortterm, transitional accommodation, outreach casework, and early intervention support for young people in Newcastle and the Hunter.

Samaritans work with young people aged 12-24 who are homeless or at risk of homelessness in Newcastle and the Lower Hunter LGA's.

We offer support to 12-15 year olds applying for HYAP and can collaborate with other services to support young people with mental health, AOD and trauma.



Youth Transitional Accommodation

Samaritans manage a number of transitional accommodation properties in Newcastle & Cessnock Local Government Area.

- These properties provide young people aged 16 24 years with access to short-term, stable and affordable accommodation, along with outreach support from a caseworker to develop skills to manage finances, health and/or connect with education and job opportunities, and skills to obtain and sustain a tenancy in rental accommodation.
- Accommodation models vary between properties, with most transitional properties providing share accommodation for young people aged between 16-24.

- All accommodation models require the young person to have some independent living skills, and accommodation is available for up to 3 months.
- Accommodation is subject to availability and specific eligibility requirements. A SHS caseworker must support all transitional accommodation applications – no direct applications are available for these properties.

Other services include:

- Early intervention
- Outreach
- Rent-it Keep-it
- Programs in schools for young people at risk of homelessness

Youth Accommodation

Samaritans Youth Accommodation supports young people to develop the skills needed to maintain a permanent and stable living arrangement.

Accommodation is subject to availability and specific eligibility requirements. Please contact the service directly for further information.

NEWCASTLE provides short-term immediate accommodation for young people aged 16-19 who are experiencing homelessness. (Crisis Accommodation).

MAITLAND provides short-term accommodation for young people aged 12-15 who are experiencing homelessness. (Crisis Accommodation).

This accommodation is focused on supporting young people where there is a goal of restoration to family.
