

- Home visiting
- Parenting Programs
- Case Management
- Assistance to link in with psychological, paediatric, drug and alcohol counselling and other support services
- Support though any court processes
- Help with understanting how to access safe housing
- Support with accessing the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS).

Each familiy joining the program will be encouraged to identify and prioritise their goals for each family member. A case manager will partner with the family to identify what is going well and to build on these strengths.
